<i>Refreshing & Dry</i> CHARDONNAY YALUMBA “Y” SERIES 2005 – (Australia) Voted Australia's best winery last year this is a quality chardonnay in its purest state, unsullied by the use of any oak. Packed with lovely pineapple, melon and grapefruit flavours and a trickle of honey, that's ideal for those that don't like their wine too rich.	Glass	Bottle
CLOUDY BAY SAUVIGNON BLANC 2005 – (Marlborough, N.Zealand) A New-World Icon and regarded as the best Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough has ever produced – We'll let you be the judge! This 2005 is a sublime vintage, vibrantly aromatic – a fusion of ginger, sweet basil and lemongrass, with layered tropical and citrus fruitsLIMITED AVAILABILITY!!!	-	£45.00
RIESLING “Y” SERIES YALUMBA 2005 – (Australia) Forget that Germanic style Riesling, this is a super, refreshingly dry wine that is packed with lovely lime and lemon flavours. A must with the scallops.	£5.80	£18.00

SANCERRE LES BOFFANTS, DUPUY 2004 – (Loire) Any list would be bare without this – a subtle Sauvignon with a lovely mineral edge and exotic gooseberry flavours, with a super long fresh finish.	£6.00	£24.00
GAVI di GAVI BRUNO BROGLIA 2005 – (Italy) This example of Gavi is one of the true great whites of Italy. Made from the Cortese grape, the wine is delicate with appley undertones, clean fresh and has a wonderful finish that goes on and on.	£5.50	£22.00
<i>Fruity</i> “THE SILLY MID ON” SAUVIGNON/SEMILLON 2005 – (Clare, Australia) For cricket lovers everywhere, this wine is produced on an old pitch, which the vineyard surrounds. Like this fielding position, you'll need good reflexes for this zesty wine that's full of tropical, lime citrus Howzat flavours!	£5.50	£22.00
CHABLIS 1er CRU MONTMAIN 2003/04 – (Burgundy) A superb example of beautifully crafted Chablis from the master J M Brocard, aged on its lees to add a complexity that provides a sublime dry wine with crisp acidity and a well-balanced finish.	-	£32.00
VISTA FLORES SAUVIGNON/CHENIN, NORTON 2005 – (Argentina) Fresh and medium bodied with tropical fruit and lively crispness, peach and mango flavours, interlaced with subtle vanilla.....A super little wine that never fails!	£3.00	£12.00
WHITE LABEL SAUVIGNON BLANC, MORTON 2003 – (Marlborough, NZ) A mature Sauvignon from New Zealand's premier growing region Marlborough. Jam-packed with delicious and lush tropical fruit. Morton was hailed as New Zealand's best winery recently– and deservedly so!	£5.80	£23.00
<i>Aromatic & Fragrant</i> POSSESSIONI BIANCO, SEREGO ALIGHIERI 2004 – (Veneto, Italy) From a beautiful ancient estate overlooking Lake Garda comes this wonderfully different wine that once tried is never forgotten. It's a delicious blend of Sauvignon Blanc, which gives it a spicy edge and Garganega, which adds elegance and length to the wine.	£5.00	£18.50
VIIGNIER, DELAS 2004 – (Rhône) From this evermore-popular varietal comes a wine that has floral notes mixing with peach apricot and a healthy dollop of cream that's rounded off with an intriguing tongue tickling hint of spice.	£3.80	£15.50
SAUVIGNON BLANC, LOS CARDOS 2004/05 – (Argentina) This is a lush, aromatic wine bursting with rich ginger and gooseberry aromas and a herbaceous palate.	£3.80	£15.00
<i>Rich & Oaky</i> CHENIN BLANC, RUITERSVLEI 2005 - (South Africa) Made from South Africa's principle white grape variety, it's a wine that was made for food, it's dry but rich and delivers a scrumptious heady mixture of honey and lime.	£3.50	£14.00
MEURSAULT LES NARVAUX 2001/03 – (Burgundy) The name says it all. It's spicy and rich on the nose, intensely buttery fruit on the palate which comes from the use of new oak.....Fantastic!	-	£44.00
COLD CREEK CHARDONNAY CHATEAU STE MICHELLE 2001(USA) This wonderful 30 year old vineyard turns out a big round, lush chardonnay. The low yielding vines produce powerful concentrated fruit. Rich, buttery and very long.	-	£29.50

RED WINE

<i>Soft & Juicy</i> KANU ROCKWOOD RED 2004 – (Stellenbosch, S. Africa) A new addition to the list! It's a funky blend of Shiraz, Cabernet and Merlot, that has a strawberry and dark chocolate nose with hints of peppery blackcurrant, nutmeg and cinnamon. Very soft and juicy, with velvety tannins. CABERNET/MERLOT, SIETE SOLES 2004/05 – (Chile) A dry red with a lip-smacking array of flavours, rich cassis and brambles with a soft juicy and spicy finish. Great for quaffing!	£4.00	£16.00
CHIANTI CLASSICO PEPPOLI, VILLA ANTINORI 2003 – (Italy) From the Champion of the “Super Tuscans” we give you this single estate Chianti classico! Full, robust with juicy black cherry and plum flavours, its very well balanced with a long aftertaste.	£3.50	£13.00
VISTA FLORES SANGIOVESE/MALBEC, NORTON 2005 – (Argentina) Norton produce this great value for money red, it has lots of mulberry fruit flavours and a velvety finish for easy drinking.	£6.00	£23.00
MASI MODELLO ROSSO 2003/04 – (Italy) A soft and juicy wine with an abundance of moorish morello cherries.....One of the most understated wines around!	£3.00	£12.00
FLEURIE 2005 – (Beaujolais, France) The epitome of a Beaujolais cru, from the grandmaster of the region, Georges Duboeuf. A fruit scented wine, sometimes silky. A great match with the lamb.	£3.80	£15.50
<i>Oaky Reds</i> RIOJA CRIANZA, CONDE DE VALDEMAR 2002 – (Spain) Made by Riojas best winery Martinez & Bujanda, this is laden with concentrated fruit and rounded, spicy flavours. The well integrated oak provides a further smattering of vanilla and coconut – this current vintage is the best yet.	£6.00	£22.00
PINOT NOIR, MORTON ESTATE 2004 – (Hawkes Bay, NZ) From the impressive Morton Estate, this wine has an incredible nose of lifted strawberries, cherries, coupled with a palate of delicate chocolate and raisins. Soft and svelt! If you want the quality of top Burgundy, but not the price-tag, try this!	£4.30	£17.50
MARGAUX DOMAINE ZEDE 2003 – (Bordeaux, France) The second wine of Chateau Labegorce-zede, the cru bourgeois exceptional is a typically delicate & fragrant claret, cedarwood and cigarbox scents make this a never forgotten old school red Bordeaux.	£5.80	£23.00
REDBANK “THE FUGITIVE” CABERNET 2002 – (King Valley, Australia) Made in the King Valley, which is Ned Kelly's old stomping ground, hence the name. Its quite elegant and restrained to begin with, but then it hits you with typical Oz fruit – lots of vanilla from the oak and cassis, mint and blackberries from the grapes.	-	£32.00
FINCA LA COLONIA MERLOT, NORTON 2004/05 – (Argentina) This is unshamably Norton Merlot, an old favourite and still as good as when we first listed it. Delicious with lots of dark squashy fruits, spice and chewy brambles. It's oaked, but it's soft and subtle with a long finish.	£5.50	£21.00
<i>Spicy Reds</i> COTES DU RHONE, ST. ESPRIT, DELAS 2003 – (Rhône, France) Cotes du Rhone is always a safe bet and this one is no exception. It has a lovely sweet, spicy peppery, fruit on the palate.	£3.80	£15.00
YALUMBA BAROSSA SHIRAZ + VIIGNIER 2003 – (Australia) Made from Shiraz grown on 30-50 year old vines, with a added splash of Viognier (5%) which gives the wine a sweet floral lift and supports the spicy peppery bouquet and plum flavours. A Barossa stalwart with an alluring twist.	£4.50	£16.50
CHATEAUNEUF-du-PAPE BEAURENARD 2003 – (Southern Rhône) Four big, spicy grapes go into this wine, Grenache, Syrah Mourvedre and Cinsault that give a very dark wine, full of black fruit and anise. It has a herbaceous bouquet and a peppery palate, with abundant soft tannins.	£5.00	£19.00
<i>Full-Bodied Reds</i> GEVREY CHAMBERTIN PERROT-MINOT 2001 – (Burgundy, France) An attractive, fleshy Pinot Noir – full of charm and finesse, it's concentrated with ripe soft berry fruits. This vintage is smooth, velvety and very approachable. This wine is ideal with a rack of lamb.	-	£36.00
RIOJA GRANDE RESERVA VALDEMAR 1997/98 – (Spain) This wine has it all, it's full of delicious vanilla and cinnamon aromas, which lead you to a silky smooth, oaky, rounded, lingering velvet finish. Tempranillo at its best.	£4.50	£18.00
AMARONE CLASSICO MASI 2001 – (Veneto, Italy) A full bodied wine made using dried grapes giving it an intensity and depth unparalleled in wine of this age. A stunning red.	-	£40.00
La RESERVE de LEOVILLE-BARTON, ST. JULIEN 2000 – (Bordeaux, France) Without a doubt the classiest wine on the list. St. Julien is the smallest of the top appellations in Bordeaux. This wine is all about force, fragrance and rich ripe tannins with loads of fruit.	-	£52.00
<i>Huge Reds</i> SANTA RITA RESERVE CABERNET 2004 – (Chile) Old world quality, new world price. An intense ruby red wine with black fruits and herbs on the nose, mixed with a mouth full of vanilla, cloves and spices. A complex oaky wine that simply must be tried!	£5.80	£24.00
“THE MENZIES” CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2000 – (Coonawarra, Australia) A huge wine. This is a classic Coonawarra, crammed with “in yer face” blackberry fruit and drying tannins with an incredibly long finish that will leave you short of breathless.	-	£38.00
PASSO DOBLE MALBEC/CORVINA, MASI 2004 – (Argentina) Made by the masters of Amarone this wine is a result of the appassimento (drying of grapes). It's a vivacious blockbuster of intensity; the flavour and length make this an experience not to be missed and at such good value.	-	£42.00
NUITS ST. GEORGES, MICHELOT 2001/02 – (Burgundy, France) A wine that oozes class! From the Burgundian master Alain Michelot. Dry, rich and full flavoured, with a distinctive pear-drop Gamy scent and bags of ripe fruit on the palate. To appreciate this wine at its best, try it with the more gamey food.	£4.00	£12.00
